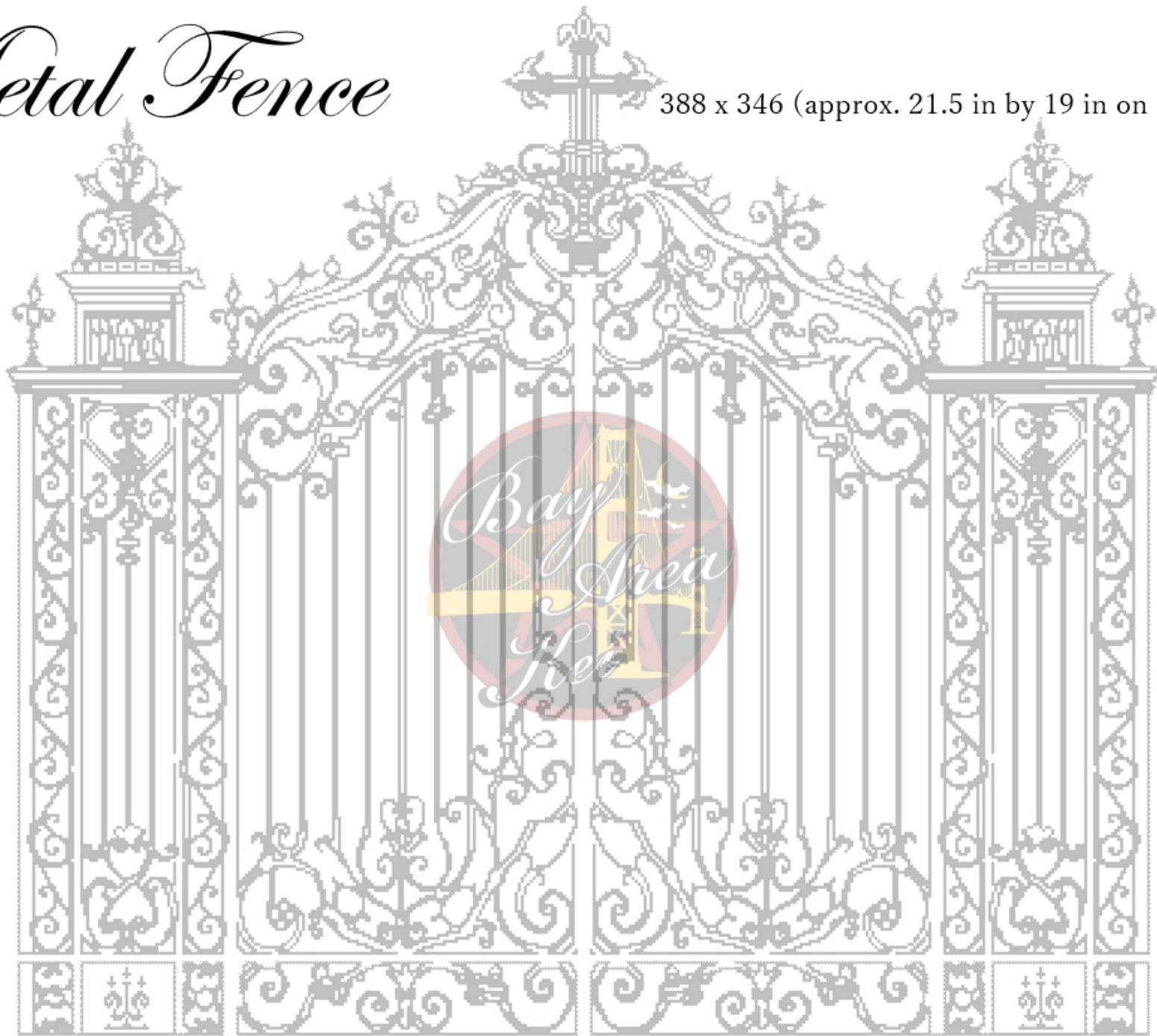

Notes:

- This is my second draft, so it could still use some revising. But hey, it's a free pattern!
- So don't sell it. *Mana-sama will curse you.*
- The design is Big. Approximately 36,000 stitches. I recommend stitching on a higher count fabric (at least 18-count).
- As printed, the design has no overlap. I prioritized legibility, so it's twenty pages. Sorry.
- There is technically another section of fence. I'm aware.
- I don't own any Moitie so I am unable to swatch check That Shade of Blue for you.
But I'd start with the Electric Blue shades (DMC 3843, 996, and 995).
